

PASTOR'S PONDERING

"As a deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God." - Psalm 42: 1

What did Jesus do without the calendar APP on the iPhone? How did He keep everything organized and on schedule? Jesus was popular with the crowds and was often pulled in more than one direction. People wanted His attention. Some were looking for healing, others for a new sense of direction. Jesus handled the constant demands on His time quite well, but I wonder how He didn't find Himself burned out! I imagine Jesus faced those days that were both energizing and exhausting...exciting and frustrating... challenging and redundant...life-giving and life-claiming.

I know I have experienced similar emotions. Some days I feel energized while on other days I feel completely exhausted. Some days I feel close to the Lord, full of joy and passion; other days I feel distant and confused. Perhaps you know what I'm talking about: life is a roller coaster of ups and downs. I am reminded of the opening paragraph of the Charles Dickens classic A Tale of Two Cities..."It was the best of times; it was the worst of times. It was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity..." We cannot escape the inevitable ride of life's joys and disappointments.

This experience also describes our walk of faith. We all have days that seem to nourish our faith, and unfortunately, we face those moments that challenge and create nothing but frustration. God never promises a life free from hardship or distress. God does promise that no matter what happens, we will never be alone or separated from the promises of God.

Part of our work in our walk of faith is to remain connected to God; it is the only way to survive "the worst of times." This is what we learn from Jesus as He struggled to face the challenges of each day. Scripture records the many times Jesus set aside time for prayer, mediation, and quiet inner restoration. Even though He was pulled in all directions, His inner soul was grounded on His relationship with God.

As we face the struggles of daily living, remember to remain connected to God's grace. This is what it means to keep the Sabbath. Find time to rest, pray, and listen for God in your life. Remember to read your Bible, attend worship, and celebrate the sacraments as much as you can. We need Sabbath each and every day to remain connected to the One who nourishes and strengthens our lives. Remember it is God who gives us strength, hope, and peace to face the demands and distractions of our daily living.

The conceptual master plan prepared by Diana Wilson includes accessible decking, a shade arbor, and an olive jar fountain. Biblical plants will also be a part of the design. Decking plans as well as benches for seating and step stones to provide access to the playground have been designed by Midway Water Gardens and Landscaping, which incorporate the existing memory stones. Carol Martyr has created a perspective sketch showing the proposed view from eye level. Our youth group is continuing to provide clean up efforts by pulling weeds, and prun-



ing overgrown plants. A large-scale poster is being prepared for display, and cost estimates to implement the project are underway!
